PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Welcome to the first newsletter of Term 3. It has been great seeing so many of you get out and visit your child's teacher over the last two days. Having parents who are engaged and supportive of their child's learning makes all the difference for each student's achievement! It also makes our job as teachers more enjoyable and rewarding. As a learning community we are in this together and I love being in a community where education is valued.

Mid-Year Data: I have just had the privilege of reviewing our student mid-year achievement data in English and Math and our students are making excellent progress. In all areas the students are ahead of where we were as a school at the mid-year point last year.



In Math 57% of our students have already met or exceeded the end of year curriculum expectation, a further 36% of students are on track to get there by the end of the year.

In English 51% of our students have already met or exceeded the end of year curriculum expectation, a further 40% are on track to get there by the end of the year.

We continue to focus our teaching on making sure all students achieve their very best and we have put in a variety of additional supports for those students who need them.

Term Three reporting: The Seesaw reports will continue to come out each fortnight this term. Below is an outline of the Curriculum areas we are covering this term.

The way they all pulled up their sleeves and worked together to get the plants in the ground was superb - despite the somewhat muddy conditions. Ross Shield: The annual Ross Shield tournament is fast approaching and the Napier Squad has just been announced. Congratulations to Akio Crofskey, Baxtar MacInnes and Samson Sherriff who have

been named in the 2024 Napier Ross Shield Team.

Attendance: We are continuing to monitor attendance closely as we know the positive impact excellent attendance has on student achievement. If there is anything creating a barrier from your child attending school please let the classroom teacher know as soon as possible so that we can support you with their attendance.

We would appreciate being informed every day the child is away from school.

School Fees/Donations: We have been able to keep our school fees/donations the same again for the third year running. Our 2024 school fees/donations are set at \$40.00 per term. These form an integral part of ensuring we can provide all the resources we want to for our students. The funds provided by the Ministry of Education do not cover all of the resources we believe are essential for every child to experience success. Over the past 12 months we have used the school donations for increased teachers in classes (reducing teacher to student ratio), increased literacy support time, increased teacher aide support, and purchased additional learning resources.

2024 Recommended School Fee/Donation: \$40.00 per term; or

- Individual Child \$160.00 per year discounted if paid in Term 1 to \$140.00.
- Two Children \$320.00 per year discounted if paid in Term 1 to \$280.00.
- Three or more children \$480.00 per year discounted if paid in Term 1 to \$420.00.

PTA Colour FUn Run


The PTA are excited to be organising a School Colour Fun Run with @nzschoolfunrun this year. Our Colour Fun Run date will be Friday, 27 September.

The Enviroschools kaupapa is about creating a healthy, peaceful, sustainable world through learning and taking action together. This Kaupapa guides all that we do and is embodied in five guiding principles that underpin the whole Enviroschools journey:

The Enviro Squad have been continuing to focus on improving the school environment. We have been researching our Native Butterflies and looking at ways we can create habitats for them at school.

Waste reduction is also always a focus. We have a large worm farm here at school with some of our pupils eagerly feeding the worms with our lunchtime food scraps. The team are making their own small worm farms to take home and Nari and Angus were the first to try this out.



Towards the end of last term we welcomed Matatriki and created the 9 whetū (stars) of Matariki using recycled resources. This was challenging but the students persevered...





WaiPatiki Planting Day

Last week the whole school was involved in our annual planting day. This year we partnered with Pan Pac, Te Huka Waiohinganga (Esk) River Care Group and HB Regional Council to improve the biodiversity along the stream at Waipatiki. This is the breeding ground for a number of Native fish, including the rare whitebait species, the banded Kokopu.

It was a hugely successful day, with approximately 3200 plants going into the ground! Many thanks to the parents and Whānau who helped us. Our pupils will remember this day for many years to come and it was a wonderful opportunity to contribute to our wider community.

Thank you also to PanPac for sponsoring our buses and providing a sausage sizzle for our team.
