### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Mathematics Curriculum: I am sure you all will have heard or read about the introduction of the New Math Curriculum for 2025. As a school we are looking forward to getting our teeth into this and have a development plan in place to ensure we implement this effectively. There is a significant amount of work involved with the new Curriculum in a relatively short time span. Our plan includes a number of professional development staff meetings along with a teacher only day which is set for Thursday 24 October. We selected this date to try and minimise the impact for our families with it being the day before a long weekend and one that often sees many of our children attend the Hawkes Bay show.

Our team have been busy preparing to host visitors from another Enviroschool, Omakere School this month. It's a great opportunity to reflect and take a good look at our own practices and what is working well, how we can make changes etc.

The Rat Trapping group continue to make a positive difference... check out their report below!


Since we started in April we have caught over 100 mice and 30 rats, making a big difference in the number of rats and mice at our school. As we continued the group expanded from five to eight people and about 30 in our Enviro group.

### **Trapping Tips & Tricks:**

- For bait we recommend using a variety of different baits such as peanut butter, nutella, nuts and cheese to see which one they like the best.
- For traps we used many different types but all ones outside where closed in so that birds and children couldn't touch it.
- We also recommend putting them in dark corners on flat surfaces.
- Also keep a tally to see how many mice and rats you catch and which traps and baits work best.
