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PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Welcome to our March newsletter. The year is certainly well underway and the students have really started their 2020 learning journey in positive fashion. It was great to see the five and six year-olds giving it their best shot at the junior swimming sports on Tuesday. I look forward to seeing our older children giving it their best tomorrow at the Onekawa Pools.

Parent/Teacher Learning conversations: We have set aside time on Monday 30 March and Tuesday 31 March for the Term 1 Parent/Teacher learning conversations. This is an opportunity to find out how your child is progressing in all areas of learning and to set some goals for the rest of 2020. On Monday 30 March school will be finishing at 12.30pm and Tuesday 31 March school will finish at the normal time of 2.45pm. The buses will run at the earlier time of 12.30pm on Monday 30 March.

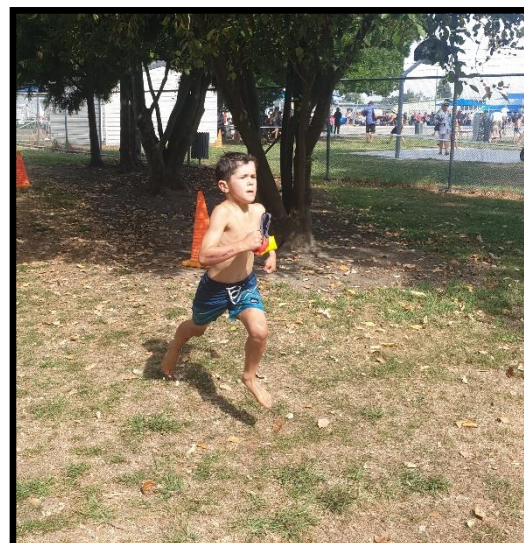

Weetbix Tryathlon: This year we had over forty students take part in the Weetbix Tryathlon at Frimley Park. It was really good to see the children pushing themselves and encouraging one another in this event that attracted over 1,500 students from around Hawkes Bay.

These have been super popular with our children with queues on the first day matching those you might expect to see on the ski field waiting to get onto the ski lift. They are certainly getting really well utilised.

Junior Swimming Sports: Our five and six year olds had the perfect day for their swimming sports on Tuesday. It was neat seeing so many parents coming along to support their children on the day. Well done to all of the 5 and 6 year olds who showed off their awesome water skills on Tuesday.

School Fees/Donations: Thank you to those who have already paid these this term. We have been able to keep the recommended school fees/donation at the same amount again this year - \$35.00 per term. These form an integral part of ensuring we can provide all of the resources we want to for our students. The funds provided by the Ministry of Education do not cover all of the resources we believe are essential for every child to experience success. Over the past 12 months we have used the school donations for increased teachers in classes (reducing teacher to student ratio), increased reading recovery time and bought some additional robotics, science and technology resources.

2020 Recommended School Fee/Donation: \$35.00 per term or

- Individual Child \$140.00 per year discounted if paid in term 1 to \$120.00.
- Two Children \$280.00 per year discounted if paid in term 1 to \$240.00.
- Three or more children \$420.00 per year discounted if paid in term 1 to \$360.00.

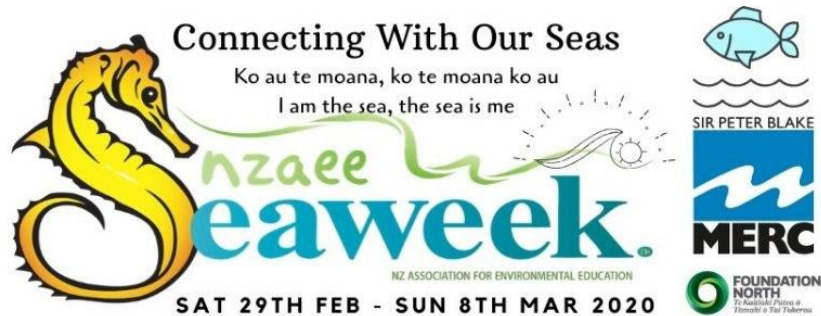
Enviro Squad News...

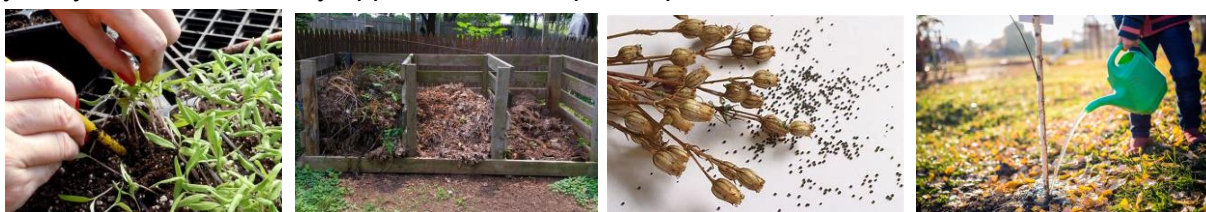
Some of the things happening in the classes that link to the environment:
